# thomas' & St. Cunta

#### The Rector Writes

In the February edition of the Halsall News, it was interesting to read letters from my predecessors about keeping Lent in 1965. I loved the call from Canon Bullough to "make a good start with celebrations of Holy Communion at **7am** or 10am." I am not sure how well received a 7am church service would be today!

Whilst the times of the church services for Ash Wednesday have changed (11am at St Thomas', 7pm at St Cuthbert's - with services in school for St Thomas' and St Cuthbert's school communities too) the focus on prayer and coming together for worship in church has not changed at all.

I recognise this is a difficult request in light of recent events within the Diocese of Liverpool. Like many of you, I was shocked and saddened by the allegations broadcast by Channel Four News at the end of January. There are many unanswered questions as well as feelings of anger and sadness. I want to assure you that St Cuthbert's is committed to upholding the dignity of all people, but to acknowledge we are also flawed human beings who are held together in the love of God.

The Church asks us to observe the 40 days of Lent as a way of preparing for Easter. This year, in our Diocese as well as St Cuthbert's, it is a time for honesty, humility, repentance, unity, hope and blessing. This year in particular, Lent is more than denying ourselves a luxury or two - it is about asking important questions:

- How do we listen well to each other and celebrate our differences?
- How do we break down the barriers that stop people encountering God's love?
- What does it mean to love God and our neighbour as ourselves, and how do we live this out with all our being?

Please do join us for our Lent course exploring how we find hope and reconciliation in our broken and hurting world, or come and immerse yourself in the majesty and holiness of worship.

#### The Disability Project Parish Grant Scheme

St Cuthbert's PCC are delighted to announce that we have been awarded a significant grant from The Archbishops' Council of the Church of England to create ramped access from the lychgate into the graveyard and church building. I would like to thank the hard work of the standing, committee at St Cuthbert's, and the Diocese for their support in helping us write the successful bid.

The grant will cover three quarters of the projected costs, which means we can now start getting all the legal permissions we need to alter the grounds of a grade one, historic building.

We hope that the community will help and support us to complete this essential but major piece of work over the next two years. At Easter we will be launching a fundraising campaign to cover the shortfall, and we hope to show you the plans at the open church event in May.

#### Halsall News Of Yesteryear— March 1967

#### EASTER

"Easter" is the English name for this great Christian festival. The original name was Pascha, and the name used still in France, for example, is "Paques." The Anglo-Saxon historian, the Venerable Bede, tells how the name Easter came to be used by the early English, as follows:—

"Eostur month... had formerly its name from a goddess of theirs who was called Eostre, whose festivals they used to celebrate in it, and from whose name they now designate the Paschal season, giving to the rejoicings of the new festival the accustomed name of the old observance." It may seem strange that the name of a pagan goddess should have been given to a Christian festival, but this has happened more than once, "Yule" was a pagan mid-winter feast, and it became transferred to the Christian feat of the Nativity—Christmas.

To me, the origin of the name Easter has a wonderful significance. The pagan festival of Eostre was a Spring festival. These pagan deities were closely associated with the seasons, and with the growth of flowers, and fruits of the earth. This would be a festival of rejoicing for the new-life and promise of Spring. After the winter the trees were budding, green blades of the crops appearing, violets and primroses, datfodils and crocuses flowering in field and hedgerow. The songs of blackbirds and thrush cheering the early morning. Men rejoiced with Nature, and worshipped the god whose influence they believed was responsible for all this, There was a core of truth behind this pagan festival which found its transfiguration and fulfilment in Christ's Resurrection to renewed life

The Resurrection speaks to us of all that Spring means, and, of course, far more. It speaks to us of Spring as something true of our own nature. The Winter of death is not the end, there follows the Spring with renewed life, fragrant, joyous, youthful.

In Easter we have the most joyful of all Christian festivals, and we English are fortunate in the name the festival bears, and its consequent inseparable relationship in our minds with the season of Spring.

#### SOME THOUGHTS FOR PASSION SUNDAY

"Our deepest need is one which we can never supply . . . it is that we should be lifted off that centre of self about which from our birth we tend to revolve, and set moving in a new orbit with God as centre." (Temple).

Self-centred as we are we cannot reorganise ourselves about some other centre. The rich young ruler came to Christ asking: "What good thing shall I do to inherit eternal life?" The answer was: "Sell all that thou hast, and take up thy cross and follow me." He turned away sorrowfully, for he had great possessions. Here it was wealth, but it might have been almost anything else—pleasures, career, fame. Most of us are infected by this canker of self-centredness. There are people, like Gabriel Oak in Hardy's "Far from the Madding Crowd," about whom Bathsheba could say that she "—had not yet learnt the simple lesson which Oak showed a mastery of by every turn and look he gave—that among the multitude of interests by which he was surrounded, those which affected his personal well-being were not the most absorbing and important in his own eyes. Oak meditatively looked upon the horizon of circumstances without any special regard to his own stand-point in the midst."

Such selflessness is all too rare!

Nowhere are the contrasts between the two orbits, the self-centred one, and the God-centred one so sharply drawn as in the story of the Passion of Christ, Christ stands out as absolutely God-centred, while in the other characters we find many gradations of self-centredness, The tragedy is due entirely to man's self-centredness.

The facts have peculiar features that we do well to note. Caiaphas, the Pharisees and Sadduces—his enemies—were not the notorious sinners upon whom society looks down, but people who were looked up to as highly respectable citizens, and members of the synagogue. Even people of ill-repute had no quarrel with him, and it was the sneer of his enemies that he was "a friend of publicans and sinners."

Indeed they were not the well known sins which shock respectable people which sent Christ to the Cross, but the respectable sins which are in the hearts of all of us, "Not the flesh, but the world, got rid of its King" Worldliness is always the effective enemy of Christ. The desires of the flesh are known and recognisable, but our deepest sin is always something of which we are unconscious, or even of which we may be proud.

They crucified Christ, and saw no harm in it, Self-centred, self opinionated, themselves and their interests determined their course. The very qualities they claimed as virtues were sinful, when they could thank God that they were not as other men are.

There is nothing so blinding as self-centredness, nor so fatal in its consequences.




I had the privilege and the pleasure of observing one of their History lessons the other week and I was really by the children's knowledge of the Roman Invasion of Britain.





What do I mean when I use the term "wildlife corridor"? A wildlife corridor is an area of land that connects fragments of good habitat, allowing wildlife to move between these spaces. Because of these connections, fragments can function more like a larger habitat area; more food and shelter is available across this larger area, and so more wildlife can be supported. The Canal and River Trust recognizes that canals act as valuable wildlife corridors and they are keen to work with us to improve our local stretch.

So, to make hedge planting a bit easier for us, volunteers from The Trust have been clearing and preparing a 25m section of canal-side near Hill Bridge. The deal is that The Trust provide the hedging whips (small hedging plants) and The Bees and Butterflies Brigade complete the planting. Planting the whips will actually be quite easy and very satisfying! We'll be meeting at **The Saracens Head** on **Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> March at 10am** – please do come along if you'd like to get involved.

Our second March meeting is on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> at 2pm in St. Cuthbert's Memorial Garden. We'll be planting beautiful, shade-tolerant shrubs that bear flowers (for pollinating insects) and berries (for birds and small mammals). Some of the shrubs will also provide good nest sites for popular birds such as robin and blackbird, which we really want to protect and encourage in the village.


